Competing for Your Club in 2011

Membership

The 2011 membership year is now underway and all club secretaries should have received the 2011 membership cards last December. Unfortunately we are receiving reports that some clubs are not distributing membership cards to their members. It is vital that members receive their membership cards, not only do they contain important information but those members who compete at qualifiers and championships may be asked to produce them at competitions. In 2010 there were a handful of incidents when competitors were not members of BRC which we obviously want to avoid. To further help us please can you ensure that your membership lists are submitted to Rhianne Pettifor: r.pettifor@bhs.org.uk Each time a new member joins this information must be passed to us without delay. Remember if an individual's details do not appear on the BRC database at the close of Preliminary Entries they will not be allowed to compete at an Area Qualifier. Also they will not be insured.

Now that January is out of the way, I am sure that you have already decided which club you are going to join this year, even if your qualifiers haven't already taken place for the Winter Dressage and Novice Indoor Show Jumping Championships.

If payments to your chosen Riding Club have cleared, do chase your Membership Card with the club secretary as you may need to produce this along with with your horse's flu vaccination certificate when you go to your qualifier. Your membership details need to be on the BRC database at the close of preliminary entries, twenty one days prior to the qualifier that you are taking part in, otherwise you will not be insured.

Should you be lucky enough to qualify and you are on a declaration sheet but your details are not on our database, we will investigate why the club secretary has not sent those details in and seek evidence to assure us beyond doubt that it was the member's full intention to compete within the rules. If this cannot be sought, then that member will have to be disqualified and therefore, the results will be recalculated. Each case will be assessed on an individual basis. Remember this is for your benefit, so please make sure that you join your local club well in time for any event that you intend to take part in. Good luck at the qualifiers!

Corresponding with BRC Head Office

Please could you make sure that when corresponding with BRC Head Office either by email or in writing, that you include your Club's full name. We currently have over 60 Clubs with initials SRC and therefore this can make responding to you specifically extremely difficult.

Lapsed Membership

Following on from the request for your club's latest membership list BRC will be carrying out a lapsed member mailing this Spring. Any member who has not renewed their membership in the past three years will receive a letter asking them why they decided to leave BRC but most importantly what we can do to encourage them to rejoin. Therefore to help us make sure that we contact genuine lapsed members please can you ensure that your membership details are as up to date as possible.

Medical Suspensions

We are continually striving to improve the provisions which we make to ensure our member's safety when competing at BRC competitions. In addition to hat tagging we have introduced a system to help us monitor any serious injuries sustained by our members and also to enforce medical suspensions in the case of a head injury. Please can you familiarise yourselves with section G28 of the 2011 Rulebook. You should already be advising BRC of any serious injuries and submitting an accident form to BRC within 24 hours of an incident. However can you please notify Laura Sanger I.sanger@bhs.org.uk telephone 02476 840594, if any member has sustained a head injury or is suspected of suffering from concussion. This will allow us to follow up any cases which may necessitate the member to be suspended on medical grounds. At club competitions where you may not have a doctor or paramedic in attendance but you are using a club first aider, as a rule of thumb, if you have called a county ambulance or advised a member to visit A&E on suspicion of a head injury or concussion please can you let Laura know and submit an accident form within 24 hours.

The BHS are proud to annouce that the 2011 Championships are to be held at Holwell Lawn, Dartmoor, Devon on the 2 - 4 September 2011.

There are a number of qualifying competitions held throughout the season at which competitors can qualify for the Championships. Classes are held for Levels 2, 3 and 4 with Pairs classes held for Levels 2 and 3.

There is also a team competition with prizes for the highest placed BRC and non-BRC teams. Competitors can qualify to compete in the National Championships by being placed first to fifth at Qualifiers (for Qualifier dates check out the BHS Website www.bhs.org.uk).

Important: BRC Disciplinary Action

Following the Quadrille Selection Trial at Aintree International Arena on 9 October 2010 where a number of horses were randomly sampled for prohibited substances the horse known as Blazing Glory ridden by Deborah Agombar was found to have phenylbutazone and acepromazine present in the sample. Following further investigations both Deborah Agombar and Heather Highton of Worlington Riding Club were found to be in breach of rules G17 to G17.4 pertaining to the abuse of prohibited substances and have been banned from competition for a period of three months.

Note: The ban of 3 months was the maximum period that a rider could be suspended for according to 2010 rules. It has now been agreed that the maximum ban for a first offence will be 2 years.

Point 2 - B turn right **add after** working trot Point 4 - E turn left **add after** working trot

A summary of BRC Rule changes for 2011

A reminder to all riders - If you are intending to compete at any BRC Championships this year, you will need to get your hat checked and tagged before you are allowed to compete. There will be a number of opportunities for you to do this when you arrive at the Championships but please allow enough time before your class starts. Please make sure you check our revised rules on protective headgear and body protectors on Page 18 of the 2011 Rule Book.

Patey Riding Hats

It has come to light recently that hat manufacturer Patey are making a riding hat with a harness which we believe that some competitiors are now buying. 
