*Eligibility for all classes can be found in the current BRC Handbook. Eligibility will be taken from the close of pre-entry. All competitors must be a member and be on the BRC Database by midday the Friday before the qualifier. Anyone failing to meet the eligibility criteria will be disqualified and informed by BRC HQ when the results are processed.*

This competition will run under BRC Rules, anyone in attendance will be bound by the BRC Code of Conduct. It is important that all competitors are aware of the rules relating to this competition – please see the current BRC Handbook and also the BRC Rule Amendments and Changes Document which can be found at the link below: <http://www.bhs.org.uk/enjoy-riding/british-riding-clubs/brc-rulebook>

All BRC code of conduct rules must be observed at the event unless the venue/organiser has given specific instructions that are still in line with health and safety guidelines. This includes: the welfare of the horses and ponies; the conduct of members, officials, volunteers and representatives; safeguarding and equality and diversity as well as social media and discipline. Examples of the code of conduct can be found in Section 1, pages 3 through to 12 of the BRC Handbook.

Members should ensure that they are up to date with the BRC code of conduct to encourage a smooth competition.

## **Entries:**

All entrants must submit a pre-entry to BRC (fees can be found in the current BRC Handbook) at least 21 days before the date of the qualifier- pre-entries close 9<sup>th</sup> June 24. Pre-entries must be made via the pre-entry website <https://brc.bhs.org.uk/login?referral=%2Fselect> . Late pre-entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organiser with a late surcharge of £10 per individual and £20 per team (payable on the BRC pre-entries website) if space permits.

**Late entries cannot be guaranteed and so therefore must not be paid for until approval from the organiser has been gained.**

### **Area Entries**

After a pre-entry has been made, the designated club member who is in charge of organising the team/individual taking part in the event must also ensure an area entry is made. The fee is confirmed by the area liaison committee and is payable to the area/host club. If a pre-entry is made, clubs are agreeing to a binding constitution which means they must make an area entry payable to the designated account, regardless of whether or not the team/individual competes.

Area entries will close on the 15<sup>th</sup> June, and at that point all entry details (using the horse's full passport name) must have been emailed through on the area entry form to [janefisherarea19@aol.com](mailto:janefisherarea19@aol.com), and all payments must have been made to St Leonards EC using the following BACS details.

### **Entry Restrictions (key points only – see BRC handbook, Section 2, pages 89 and 90 for full eligibility criteria)**

No horse may compete in more than one class. For 70cm entries, riders may not have competed at BE90, AE90 or BRC HT90 in the current competition year at the close of entries; horses may be registered with BE however are not to have any BE points and cannot have completed a BE90 or above in the current or previous calendar year. There are further eligibility criteria for horses competing at 80cm and 90cm.

## **Flu Vaccinations**

Your horse must have up to date influenza vaccinations in line with rule G7 in the current BRC Handbook. There is also a checking device on the BRC website. If you are unsure, please email Jane – [janefisherarea19@aol.com](mailto:janefisherarea19@aol.com)

If your vaccination is out of date and the course needs to be restarted, then you must apply for a yellow card from BRC/will be given a yellow card at the qualifier by the official steward. This will enable competitors to continue competing but ensure that they must follow up on the vaccination.

Horses and ponies cannot be vaccinated within the 6 days before competition.
